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### **HOME NEWS**

We have enjoyed a fantastic year so far at Windsor Court and it looks like 2024 will continue to be a great year for the home. We have welcomed some wonderful new residents who have settled in well and our team have been hard at work, continuing to provide a comfortable and safe environment for our existing residents.

We have been working closely with the Trusted Assessors within our local NHS trust to ensure the safe transition of residents coming into our care. This scheme means patients are assessed within the hospitals before being discharged so that the process can be made as safe and efficient as possible, providing our care staff with assessments and care plans for the residents ready for their arrival.

The planned renovation works to the second floor of the home have now commenced. Things are progressing well and we are anticipating being able to open up several of the newly renovated rooms to residents in October. It is quite a big project but will make a big difference to the home, we are hopeful that all works will be completed by spring 2025.



Our hair salon is also going to be given a refresh and will be redecorated very soon. We hope the residents will enjoy having their hair done and other treatments in the new salon. These planned projects are part of our goal to continually improve the home and the environment for our residents. While these works are taking place we will of course do everything we can to keep disruption to a minimum and not interrupt the residents' daily routine.

If you are interested in finding out about our plans for the home this year and speaking to our staff, we will be holding a relatives meeting on Wednesday 21st August and we would love to see as many of you there as possible. In addition to home updates, we will also be joined at the meeting by our wonderful trainer who will be speaking about dementia care and support. It should be a very interesting session and a great opportunity to ask any questions you have about supporting those with dementia.

A couple of months ago we were honoured to host a memorial for one of our former residents. Gerald and Jean Dixon had been residents at Windsor Court before Gerald sadly passed away earlier this year. When we were approached by Gerald's nephew about holding a memorial at the home so his family could come together with Jean to celebrate Gerald's life, we of course wanted help. Our Team Leader, Georgina worked closely with the family to arrange the memorial, alongside Debbie our Activities Coordinator and the kitchen team who arranged refreshments for the guests.

We received some very kind feedback from Gerald's nephew Chris about the memorial and the help provided by our staff. "She [Georgina] offered to create a background slide show to run during the event. This involved sitting with my aunt and scanning photographs from numerous albums and then putting into a PowerPoint presentation. She also created small memorial notes that guests could take with them. I am sending off some of these to family and friends who were unable to attend on the day."

"Other staff helped on the day with arrangements, flowers on tables and with hot and cold drinks. Debbie Page also helped a great deal on the day and is also to be highly commended. To see these staff members bending down literally to talk with my Aunt Jean and other residents who came into the room being used was really touching. We had family members who had travelled from Essex and the lake district to be with my aunt. We all felt the same and our thanks goes out to you all."

#### **STAFF NEWS**

The Windsor Court team has grown and changed this year and we are grateful for the fantastic team of staff we have built to care for our residents.

Katherine Felton is now officially registered as manager at Windsor Court, having gone through the interview process and successfully completing her registration over the past few months. Congratulations to Katherine, we have all seen your dedication and hard work throughout this process.

The entire team are thrilled to support Katherine in her next steps as Home Manager. We are also fortunate to still have the support of Anna in the home in a consultant role and are incredibly grateful for her work at the home as Interim Manager over the past few years.

Over the past couple of months we have seen several new additions to the Windsor Court team. In June we welcomed Jasneet and Dinesha as Senior Care Assistants, Anaswara as Care Assistant and Anais as Kitchen Assistant. All these new members have settled in well to their roles and are enjoying being part of our team. We are also looking forward to welcoming some new team members in the coming months who you will likely meet soon.

Caroline, who is a member of the care team, will now be helping Debbie our Activities Coordinator by providing additional activities support for two days a week. This means we are able to put on even more fun and engaging activities for our residents and be able to offer one-on-one support with hobbies or time to chat about anything on their mind.

It is always wonderful to see our staff expand their skills or knowledge, either by transitioning into new roles in the home or taking part in training. Recently our staff have attended fire safety training, end of life training and first aid training. All of these sessions have been very useful for the staff members in attendance and help us to ensure we are following industry best practices.





In a few months we will be welcoming the Dementia Bus back to Windsor Court. This is a valuable educational experience that some of our staff members have taken part in previously. On the Dementia Bus our staff are able to get an insight into what it is like living with dementia, through an immersive experience where they can walk in the shoes of someone with dementia. This will be a very valuable experience for the staff taking part and enable them to better relate to and support any residents at Windsor Court who are struggling with the symptoms of dementia.

In addition to the training being carried out within the home, our team often choose to pursue their own individual training and qualifications to further their skills. Takunda is currently working towards her level 7 qualification in health and social care and has put in a lot of time and effort to achieve this goal.

This year we are celebrating the work anniversaries of several long-standing members of the Windsor Court team. In August, Draupadi who is a member of our domestic team celebrates 13 years at the home and in November, Marcus from our care team will celebrate his 10 year anniversary. We are proud to have created a workplace and an environment for our team members where they feel supported and are happy to spend so many years of their careers in the care industry.

It is always lovely to see the hard work of the Windsor Court staff being appreciated and to know that what we do is making a difference. Recently we received this lovely gift for our team from the family of one of our residents, alongside a very thoughtful note. This was really appreciated by the entire team and we enjoyed sharing these tasty treats.
